About The Course

- ◆ **Fundamentals of Environmental Education** is based on the "Guidelines for the Initial Preparation of Environmental Educators" document produced by the North American Association for Environmental Education (NAAEE). The course was developed by the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point in collaboration with national EE experts, using materials produced by organizations such as NAAEE, World Wildlife Fund, Project Learning Tree, Project WILD, and Project WET.

What Will Students Learn?

- ◆ The course strives to provide educators with the knowledge and skills necessary to incorporate quality environmental education into their instruction. Students discuss the history, definition, and goals of environmental education and develop an understanding of the professional roles and instructional methods of environmental educators.

Fundamentals of Environmental Education will be valuable to pre-service and in-service teachers as well as natural resources or environmental science majors that want to learn about environmental education.

- ◆ Obtain the course from the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point.
- ◆ The course comes as a CD of HTML documents that were created using Microsoft FrontPage. The web-ready version of the course allows you to copy the pages on to your server and use the course on the Web. The system-ready version allows you to load the content into a course management system (recommended).
- ◆ You may easily edit the content of the course to meet your needs using a Web page development software program such as FrontPage.
