



Air Quality




The Air Quality series addresses a range of air pollution topics, including “criteria pollutants” (particulate matter, sulfur dioxide, ozone, nitrogen oxides, carbon monoxide, and lead), acid rain, indoor and outdoor air pollution and prevention, and depletion of the stratospheric ozone layer.

The EERG activities make sense of how air pollution is caused by various sources and what can be done to control and reduce the amount of pollution entering the atmosphere.

Nonpoint Source Pollution Prevention

The Nonpoint Source Pollution Prevention series addresses water pollution caused by surface runoff from agriculture, urban areas, mining, forestry, and construction activities. The EERG activities define nonpoint source pollution and make sense of how water can be polluted by sediment, bacteria, toxics, and nutrients, and what can be done to control and reduce the amount of pollution entering water bodies.
